- * champion the principles, key directions and policies of Melbourne 2030 to the constituencies that the members represent and to the general community

- * review progress and identify any shortcomings or impediments related to the implementation of Melbourne 2030 and make suggestions as to improvements
- * draw attention to emerging issues which need response or which provide new opportunities to advance Melbourne 2030 Directions
- * provide feedback prior to the release of documents relating to the implementation of Melbourne 2030, including the draft Submissions Analysis Report
- * provide feedback on governance arrangements for the implementation of Melbourne 2030
- * assist in the development of business, government and community understanding, support and commitment to implementation of the Directions, policies and sustainable development principles of Melbourne 2030
- * provide advice on the periodic enhancement and updating of Melbourne 2030

- * Since its establishment, the Group has met nineteen times and prepared three reports - 'Priority Implementation Issues', 'Challenges to the Implementation of Activity Centre Policy' and 'Response to the Metropolitan Transport Plan Report' (see Project Outputs).

* Following the announcement of Stage 2 of the first five-yearly audit of Melbourne 2030, a final meeting of the group was held on 6 August 2007 to review the issues raised in its work. The Minister for Planning wrote to members and attended the final meeting to thank them for their work.

Project Priority

This project is delivering on Initiative 9.3.1 in the Melbourne 2030 five year Implementation Program – Establish processes for regular consultation with major stakeholder groups on overall progress in implementing Melbourne 2030.

Project Outcomes

Increased knowledge and ownership of the principles, key directions and policies of Melbourne 2030 amongst key stakeholder groups and the general community and effective and efficient implementation of Melbourne 2030.

Advice to the Minister for Planning through the Melbourne 2030 Implementation Reference Group's reports:

IRG Priority Implementation Issues Report (PDF - 147 Kb)

The Implementation Reference Group released its report to Government regarding the implementation of Melbourne 2030 in February 2004.

It reiterated its support for Melbourne 2030 and recognised the State Government's work in the past two years in putting Melbourne 2030 into practice only two years into the 30-plan. The report makes a number of suggestions for implementation and highlights five issues which are considered critical to ensuring the future success of the strategy.

IRG Activity Centres Report (PDF - 364 Kb)

The Group's report was released in July 2004. The Minister for Planning welcomed the report, which identifies 11 key issues and associated priority actions to help guide the implementation of Melbourne 2030's activity centres policy.

IRG Response to Metropolitan Transport Plan Report (PDF - 163 Kb)

The Group's report was completed in February 2005. The report considers the implications of the Metropolitan Transport Plan (MTP) for Melbourne 2030 and assesses it against the priority actions identified by the Group in its two previous reports.
